Mark Harmon, the Bay Area-based

Auberge founder, bets big on

Fort Lauderdale.

As the founder of the Auberge Resorts Collection, which began with the culinary mecca Auberge du Soleil in Napa Valley and has expanded across the country into newbuild residences, Mark Harmon can spot a trend. His advice is to think beyond Miami-to Fort Lauderdale, and likens the geographic shift to what he saw in the Bay Area. "In San Francisco, everyone wanted to be in Pacific Heights," he recalls, "but now look what's happened in the Mission-it's dynamic and fun." His foresight is paying off.
